Abstracts: Tax is usually the last thing on people's mind when they are setting up a new business. However, if a start-up company is not structured correctly, it may limit the Company's access to capital and the Company may pay taxes that can be avoided legally with proper planning. The speaker will share with the audiences the important tax and business considerations for starting up a global business and highlight some of the traps for the unwary.
